

6 IPC General Assembly

6.1 EPC Representation in Beijing

As an independent and full member of IPC, EPC has, for the first time, the opportunity to attend IPC's GA with voting and speaking rights. Each member is entitled to send up to two delegates. EPC wishes to take advantage of this opportunity, and the General Assembly is being invited to determine who should represent it.

The current Executive's recommendation is that the final decision be taken by the incoming Executive. It is of the opinion that those best placed to represent EPC are the President and Secretary General.

6.2 EPC motions for IPC GA

As an independent and full member of IPC, EPC has, for the first time, the opportunity to submit motions for consideration by IPC's General Assembly.

Motions will be taken from the floor and, if seconded, will be debated and voted upon. Only those motions which enjoy a simple majority will be submitted to IPC.

6.3 EPC Nominations for the IPC Governing Board.

Again, as an independent and full member of IPC, EPC has, for the first time, the opportunity to submit nominations for the IPC Governing Board. Elections to the Governing Board will take place this coming November in Beijing.

Nominations will be taken from the floor and will be voted upon. In the same way as any other IPC member, EPC may nominate up to three candidates. If three people are nominated, at least one of these must be female. Nominations will be considered separately in the following order: President, Vice-President and Member-at-Large.

6.4 EPC Nominations for IPC Committees

Finally, EPC now also has the right to put forward names to serve on the twelve IPC Standing Committees. Nominations will be taken from the floor and will be voted upon. Nominations enjoying the support of the General Assembly shall be submitted to IPC for its consideration.
